CONSTRUCTION OF A STEEL TWIN-SCREW SEAGOING TORPEDO BOAT

Contract, of two parts, made and concluded this and between THE HEREESHOFF MANUFACTURING COMPANY, a corporation created under the laws of the State
of Rhode Island, and doing business at Bristol, in said State, represented by the President of said corporation
PARTY OF THE PHENT PART, and THE UNITED SYATES, represented by the Secretary of the Navy, PARTY OF THE

Whereas, after due advertisement, the proposal of the said party of the first part to construct two of said

Whereas it is provided by the advertisement of the Secretary of the Navy, dated July 1, 1895, inviting proposals for building said vessels, that they shall be constructed in accordance with certain provisions con-tained in the act entitled "An act to increase the naval establishment," approved August 3, 1886, and shall be

in all their parts of domestic manufacture; and WHEREAS the drawings, plans, and specifications required by the said act have been duly provided,

adopted, and approved in accordance with the provisions thereof. States as follows, that is to say

First. The party of the first part will, at its own risk and expense, construct, in accordance with the provisions of the acts of Congress relating thereto, and in conformity with the aforesaid drawings, plans, and specifications, one steel twin-serew seagoing torpedo boat of about one hundred and eighty tons displacement. with fittings and equipment as specified, of the following principal dimensions:

The construction of the vessel herein contracted for, (the word vessel as used here and hereafter are hereto annexed and shall be deemed and taken as forming a part of this contract with the like operation and effect as if the same were incorporated herein. No omission in the drawings, plans, or specifications of any detail, and intent of the acts of Congress above referred to, shall operate to the disadvantage of the United States, but sideration of the premises expressly waived; and it is hereby further provided, and this contract is upon the thereof, and the damage, if any, caused thereby shall be ascertained, estimated, and determined by a beard of naval officers, appointed by the Secretary of the Navy, and that the party of the first part shall be bound by the determination of said board, or a majority thereof, as to the amount of increased or diminished com-pensation which the said party of the first part shall be entitled to receive, if any, in consequence of such change or changes.

Third. The materials and workmanship used and applied in the construction of the vessel herein contracted.

nanted, and agreed that the said Secretary may appoint suitable inspectors, to whom the party of the first part shall furnish such samples of said materials, and such information as to the quality thereof and the manner of using the same, as my be required, and also any assistance such inspectors may require in deter-mining the weight and quality of steel and other metals, and of wood and other materials, either used or intended for use in the construction of the vessel, and that the inspectors may with the approval of the said Secretary, peremptorily reject any unfit material or forbid the use thereof. The inspectors shall, at all times during the progress of the work, have full access thereto, and the party of the first part shall furnish them with full facilities for the inspection and superintendence of the same. Fourth. The steel to be used in the construction of the vessel herein contracted for shall conform to the

"Specifications for inspection of steel for use in the construction of the hulls and machinery of torpedo boats Nos. 6, 7, and 8, for the United States Navy," approved by the Secretary of the Navy under date of July 19, 1895, which specifications are annexed to and form a part of this contract.

2. Payments shall be made by the party of the second part in five equal installments, as the work progresses, with a reservation of ten per cent from each installment.

3. No payment shall be made except upon bills, in quadruplicate, certified by the General Inspector of vessel, in such manner as shall be directed by the Secretary of the Navy, whose final approval of all bills the vessel.

4. All warrants for payments under this contract shall be made payable to the party of the first part or its

5. The payment of the last installment shall not be made except as provided for in the tenth clause hereof.

When all the conditions, covenants, and provisions of this contract shall have been performed and fulfilled by and on the part of the party of the first part, said party of the first part shall be entitled, within ten
